Minutes of the Branch Executive Committee Meeting February 15, 2024:

Treasurer Al Wuthnow reported that our current cash balance is \$6,658. That's down considerably from last year due to members who haven't paid annual dues. Al passed out a list of those 26 delinquent members and board members volunteered to call them as a reminder. For next year, annual dues will be increased to \$50 but those who pay by December 31 get a \$10 discount. Al also said he paid the State Sirs organization the quarterly assessment based on 77 members on our rolls in December. Dick Robinson said minutes for last month's meeting were sent out in the February Horologium. Kelly Reid said our current membership is 85 members after several new members were accepted. Ken Kauer reported that Bob Rigler's wife had passed away at the end of January. Tom Verkozen (our new Little Sir) said he'd like information on people backing up officers in their duties.

Speakers lined up for the coming months include Dick Spotswood for March, Michael St John for April, a representative from California High Speed Train Project for May and a galactic astronaut for June. Kelly Reid is trying to contact sportswriter Joan Ryan and Michael Pritchard for later months. For the March 7 meeting, Ted Pullen will handle lunch tickets and Ken Kauer will sell raffle tickets. Michael said he and Tom Verkozen plan to go to the State Sirs meeting in March. Some discussion was made about the accessibility of our website. About half our board members have used the website. Ted Pullen submitted a report on the Branch 7 trip to SF to see the Lion King in December. 56 persons paid to attend this show at a total cost of \$6,608. Lucky 7 golf is starting weekly play on March 6. Ladd Sievenpiper is leading a walking group that meets each week at 9 am on Thursdays at Hamilton Field. Some ideas for future trips were proposed including: visiting the aircraft carrier USS Hornet, the Liberty ship Jeremiah O'Brien, the Buck Institute, Fort Ross, and Lagunitas Brewery in Petaluma. Dave Bernardi is working to set up a wine tasting date at the Jacuzzi winery in Sonoma.

Al Wuthnow reported the February Valentine lunch was only attended by 35 members and 25 ladies plus a few other guests for a total of 63 persons. He wondered if we should continue having this event which includes ladies as guests since the turnout was rather low. The cost of \$55 for prime rib and \$45 for salmon or pasta was mentioned as a possible reason. Michael Sommer said he'd ask the members at our March lunch meeting whether they want to continue holding the Valentine luncheon with ladies invited. A different type of event would be a summer picnic at a local park with guests invited.
