Executive Board Meeting January 18, 2024:

Al Wuthnow reported our cash balance is now \$6,667 due to collection of dues from some 50 members. But that leaves a number of members now in arrears for their 2024 dues. We need to collect dues from all members because we are assessed quarterly dues by the state Sirs organization for each active member.

The minutes of Dec Exec Board Meeting by Secretary Dick Robinson were approved. The only change to be made is that Tom Verkozen is taking over as Little Sir in place of Dr Bob Bundy.

Kelley Reid presented the applications for 5 new members: Bill McCarten, Fred Coito, Armando Castagna, Rene Sommer and Ed Briggs. These 5 men were approved as new members. Ralph Sherer said Robby Robinson is preparing the roster booklet for Branch 7. It will be going to print fairly soon.

Scott McKown reported on the state of our website. He said we have 10 activities highlighted but he asked for photos of members participating in the various activities we have listed.

We reviewed the list of speakers lined up for the coming months. These include Peter Robinson (review of Broadway musicals) in February, Dick Spotswood (political commentator) in March, Michael St John (Marin Search and Rescue) in April, and a representative from the California Bullet Train in May. Joan Ryan (sportswriter) and Michael Pritchart are being contacted for future meetings.

Michael reported that Ted Pullen has only received 24 people who signed up for the Valentine lunch on February 1. Ladd Sievenpiper said he'd work on sending out an Evite to get more people signed up.

Michael said that Ted Pullen was Sir of the month in January and Ralph Sherer was chosen to be Sir of the Month in February. He read off a list of other worthy members to be considered for this honor in the coming months. Michael was granted the authority to pick the men for this honor.

Dave Bernardi told us he has contacted Jacuzzi winery in Sonoma about hosting a wine tasting event in April. He is working out the details for this event. Another possible outing would be beer tasting at Lagunitas brewery in Petaluma. We'll consider an outdoor event at a local park for summer.
